Dear SLC Member,

I'm pleased to report that the House Committee, with Board approval, will be implementing the following amendment to our dress code policy.

Beginning April 1, 2017, business-appropriate denim may be worn on the 14th floor at breakfast, lunch or dinner, in the dining room or the private rooms. Business-appropriate denim is defined as dark in color, not faded, neat and clean with no holes or rips. White denim slacks are acceptable for women.

This amendment is in response to many comments made on our last membership survey. Following the survey, management did extensive research on the topic, contacting other city clubs across the country, as well as conferring with local clubs. The resulting data confirmed that more than 95% of like city clubs had at least one area where appropriate denim was acceptable. All further agreed that allowing denim was crucial to staying abreast of current business needs, thus remaining relevant to their memberships.

I want to assure you that we will continue to maintain our current dress code policy on the 15th floor, where jackets are required in the dining room. We feel fortunate to have the space to be able to separate these dress code differences on a floor by floor basis, thereby allowing you to choose which you prefer on a given day.

The House Committee is confident that this change will allow our members more flexibility and the opportunity to utilize the Club more frequently. Should you have any specific questions about what is or is not acceptable, feel free to contact Mike Brady directly.
